## MHSC FACILITY USE \& PARKING GUIDANCE FOR CONTESTANTS

Dale Pahlke Arena at the Dakota Community Bank \& Trust Rodeo Grounds


- PARKING - Contestant parking is north of arena. Do not park in spectator area southeast of arena or on off-site properties not under ownership of the Mandan Park District.
- STAY OFF THE HEART RIVER DIKE and do not ride horses across the street.
- PEN RENTALS. Available during events, \$20/night. Outdoor, uncovered, approx.. 10X10, no bedding, clean-up required, $\$ 50$ fine for failure to do so. Reserve in advance at www.mandanhorseandsaddle.com/penrentals and make payment (plus 3\%) via Paypal to mhsc_entries@outlook.com. Online rental system forthcoming for high school rodeos.
- PENNING OF HORSES - Not inside chain link fence; gates locked overnight. With the exception of the camping area, moderate-sized pens allowed in parking areas by trailers (not around trees). Clean-up required.
- PENNING AROUND TREES \& TYING HORSES TO TREES PROHIBITED - Bark damage may expose trees to disease.
- CAMPING SPOTS - Map at http://www.dacotahspeedway.net/fans/campground.aspx.
- Parking in utility spaces by rental only with advance reservation and payment.
- No horse pens in camping areas.
- Other than for high school rodeos, reserve online via Dacotah Speedway or contact Casey Martins, 701-202-8315.
- By Aug. 1, specific instructions and fees for the high school rodeo will be posted to the MHSC Facebook page, www.mandanhorseandsaddle.com and NDHSRA website.
- The speedway may have rented spaces to non-contestants. Avoid riding near campers.
- MANURE CLEAN-UP REQUIRED - Look for wheel barrows and manure forks at concrete bunkers by pens and/or temporary stations for deposit of manure and hay from around your trailer, or place in your trailer. No piles left behind.
- WATER HYDRANTS - At west entrance gate to speedway and along west fence near cattle holding pens.
- ARENA GATES - Contestants enter arena on north center gate for speed events, exiting on NW corner. Enter on NW corner for roping events.
